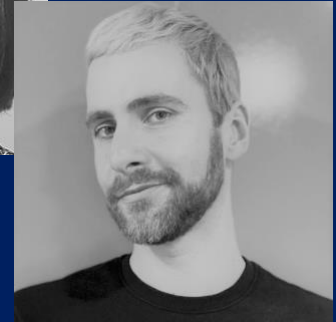

## **Title: The Benefits of Work-Based Learning**

### **Abstract: Beliefs and Attitudes that Influence Learning**

### **Clare Heaney** – Director of Studie @ North West Academy of English
